The aim of the conference is to present the challenges posed to the public sector organizations by the development of project activities, and the role that project management plays in the transformation process of the public sector in Poland and around the world.

The conference is aimed at both researchers and practitioners of project management. The keynote addresses will include references to best practices and interesting case studies. We welcome papers based on secondary research (quantitative, qualitative, and mixed), as well as reviews and polemics.

The Academic Committee for the Conference will announce the list of papers accepted for the conference, and reserves the right to reject any paper that does not receive a positive review.

CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

It is the organizers' intention that the conference should become an inspiration for academic reflection, which will result in publications concerning the evaluation of public policies and projects. The conference papers should be either in Polish, or English.

The submitted texts, following a favourable review, can be published:

- in the *Zarządzanie Publiczne Zeszyty Naukowe ISP UJ (Public Management Magazine)* quarterly, subject to compliance of the papers with the profiles of the periodical, or
- in a monography (with an ISBN number) on Public Sector Project Management to be published in the digital form by the Institute of Public Affairs of the Jagiellonian University

Authors who do not speak Polish should send abstracts of papers and full papers only in English.

FEES

The conference fee includes conference materials, participation in the scholarly programme and accompanying programme, dinner, and gala dinner (1 EUR is approximately 4,3 PLN)

- fee for participation in the conference with paper delivery / presentation in the poster form: PLN 980.00
- fee for participation in the conference for staff and graduate students of the Jagiellonian University Faculty of Management and Social Communication: PLN 650.00
- fee for participation in the conference without paper - PLN 650.00
- fee for paper submission without participation in the conference: PLN 650.00

The conference fee does not include accommodation and travel expenses.

In the event of cancellation of participation in the conference before 15th October 2013, 50% of the fee will be refunded. Cancellation of participation after 15th October 2013 will not result in a refund. The only valid form of cancellation shall be in writing.

ABOUT JAGIELLONIAN UNIVERSITY
